of the County Court of the same County held at Elizabeth
Town in and for the aforesaid County on the fourth Tuesday
and Twenty second day of August in the year of our
Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty six —
Nevertheless we grant unto him the said William
Baker our firm Peace and will not that he suffer
any Corporal or other Punishment therefor but that he
shall stand and be in the same Plight and Condition
to all Intents and Purposes whatsoever as if the
Crimes whereof he the said William Baker hath been
convict or either of them had never been done or
committed Provided that the said William Baker
shall transport himself or cause himself to be trans-
ported out of this State within Twenty days from
the delivery of these Presents and never return
back into it again —

the State of Maryland this Twentieth day of
September in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and eighty six —
