

and Jesse Jarrot of said County; that the said Jarrot in
 order to establish his Possession in the said Land, fitted up a
 small House or rather Rabbin, and put therein a certain Mar-
 -quet Project to retain the Possession thereof; that the
 said Mc Grill afterwards threw down the said Rabbin and
 set fire to the same about 11^o Clock A.M. whereby it was
 consumed - that the said Mc Grill in consequence of the Premises
 is indicted in Harford County Court for a Capital Felony - and
 and the said Memoriatists having humbly solicited the in-
 -terposition of Government - I have thought proper to order
 and direct that all Proceedings at Law for the said Offence
 so far as respects Felony, do cease and determine, and
 that no further Prosecution be had or carried on against
 the said Patrick Mc Grill for or concerning the same;
 but nothing herein contained shall prevent or be construed
 to prevent a Prosecution for a Trespass, or the recovery
 of Damages.
