

Annapolis June 15. 1787.

Whereas it appears by the Representation of the Justices of St^h Marys County that a certain Henry Philips hath been presented in the County Court of the said County for stealing an Iron wedge, which he was induced to by the artifice of certain persons who contrived to lay the wedge in his way, afterwards prevailed upon the said Philips to Run away, and in his absence carried off all his Effects - I have thought proper to order and direct that all Proceedings at Law for the said Offence do cease and determine, and that no further Prosecution be had or carried on against the said Henry Philips for or concerning the same.
