W. Smallwood Whereas George Stophell late of
Frederick County, Labourer, hath been indicted,
tried and found guilty, in the County Court of
the same County, begun and held at Frederick Town on the third Tues-
-day of August in the year Seventeen hundred and Eighty seven, of
feloniously Stealing, taking and carrying away nine pieces of Silver
Money commonly called Spanish Milled Dollars of the value of fifty
pounds of Tobacco each piece, two other pieces of silver money common-
-ly called french crowns of the value of fifty pounds of Tobacco
each piece, fifteen other pieces of silver money commonly called quar-
-ters of Spanish Dollars of the value of ten pounds of Tobacco, each
piece, three other pieces of silver money commonly called English
Shilling pieces of the value of five pounds of Tobacco each piece
and one old black leather pocket Book of the value of five
pounds of Tobacco, of the Goods and Chattels of a certain Frederick
Hoffman, and the said George Stophell for the offence aforesaid
was sentenced to receive thirty lashes on his bare back at the
public whipping Post and Pay four shillings and fees. And
