To all our Bailiffs and good
Peple to whom these Presents shall
come Greeting.

Know ye that of our especial Grace
We have Pardoned unto Frank Cole late of Prince Georges County
Labourer as a proper Object of our Mercy the Suit of our peace
and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that he on the tenth
Day of December in the year of our Lord One thousand seven
hundred and eighty seven between the hours of ten and twelve
in the Night of the same Day with force and arms at
Prince Georges County aforesaid the Dwelling house of Frederick
Kooontz there situate feloniously and burglariously did break
and enter and a sum of money of the value of five
shillings current money and a coat of the value of twenty
shillings current money of the Goods and Chattels of the
said Frederick Kooontz in the said Dwelling house then
and there being then and there feloniously and burglariously
did steal, take and carry away against the peace Govern-
ment of the State, whereof he the said Frank Cole hath
been convicted before the worshipful David Crauford, John
Smith Brookes, and Rinaldo Johnson Judges of a special
Court of Oyer and Terminer and Goal delivery for Prince
Georges County in the State of Maryland, hold at upper
Marlborough Town at the Court house of said County on the
tenth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand
seven hundred and eighty eight Nevertheless we grant
unto him the said Frank Cole our full Peace and Will
