he ~~was~~ ~~was~~ on the fifth Day of June in the year of our Lord One
thousand seven hundred and eighty seven with force and arms at
Montgomery County aforesaid and within the Jurisdiction of the
County Court of the same County the Store house of a certain Henry
Brookes situate at Montgomery aforesaid by the said Michael
broke and entered and one woman's saddle of the value of forty
shillings, one piece of brown broad cloth containing fifteen
yards of the value of One hundred shillings of the Goods
and Chattels of the said Henry Brookes then and there being
found, then and there feloniously stole took and carried away
contrary to the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided
and against the Peace Government and Dignity of the State,
