

77 having found the said Topping Smith Guilty of Manslaughter
he will be subjected to the great Ignominy and expense of a public
trial the expense of which must unavoidably involve him in Ruin
praying a Nolle Prosser to stay further proceedings against him
respecting the said offence and several respectable inhabitants of
Anne Arundel County aforesaid having strongly recommend
ed him to the favour of Government I have thought
proper to order and direct that all proceedings at Law for the
said Offense do cease and determine and that no further Prosecu
tion be had or carried on against the said Topping Smith for
or concerning the same

Renner then and there being found feloniously did Steal
take and lead away contrary to the form of the act of Cap-
