 Tuesday before the Monday preceding the first Tuesday in
 February in the Year of our Lord One Thousand seven hun-
 dred and Eighty eight. Nevertheless we grant unto him
 the said Hiram Husband our firm Peace and will not that
 he suffer any corporal or other Punishment therefor but that
 he shall stand and be in the same Plight and Condition to all
 Interests and Purposes whatsoever as if the Crime whereof he the
 said Hiram Husband hath been Convict had never been
 done or committed. But we do expressly Will and enjoin
 as the terms and Condition of our Pardon that the said Hiram
 Husband shall within twenty Days after the delivery hereof
 depart this State and never after return back into it.
