Know ye that of our especial Grace we
have pardoned unto John Webb Late of Baltimore County
Yeoman as a proper object of our Mercy the Suit of our
Peace and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that he on the
Twenty ninth Day of November in the Year of our Lord One
thousand seven hundred and Eighty seven with force and Arms
at the County of Baltimore One Gelding of the value of
ten Pounds Current Money of Maryland of the Goods and Chattels
of John Hapelbaugh then there being found then and there felon-
ously did steal take and lead away against the Peace Government
and Dignity of Maryland and so forth and against the form of
the Act of Assembly in that Case made and provided whereof
he the said John Webb hath been Convict before the Worshipful
John Hoale and others Justices of the County Court of the said
County held at the Court house in Baltimore Town
