Smallwood Greeting Whereas on the seventh Day
of March last, our Warrant of Execution
for James Sands, and Jacob Dyer of Baltimore County, did issue,
to be had on Wednesday the nineteenth of the same Month - And
Whereas on the seventh of March aforesaid, our Commission
and Order to the Sheriff of the said County did issue, requiring
and commanding him to suspend the Execution of the said
Warrant until Wednesday the second Day of April then next,
or until our further pleasure - And also on the twenty ninth
Day of March aforesaid, we did issue our further Order
requiring and commanding the said Sheriff to suspend
the Execution of the Warrant aforesaid until Saturday the
twelfth Day of this instant April or further pleasure -
Now ye that for divers reasons us therunto moved
we do now order and direct, as also charge and com-
-mand you, that you further Delay the Execution of the
said Warrant until Friday the twenty fifth Day of this
instant April, or until our further pleasure shall be known
in the Premises any thing heretofore contained in this
