Whereas on the sixth Day
 of March last our Warrant did issue for the Execution of
 James Sands and Jacob Dyer of Baltimore County who had been
 convicted of Robbing on the High way, before the County Court of
 the said County hold at the Court House in Baltimore Town in
 and for the County aforesaid the Tuesday before the Monday pre-
 -ceding the first Tuesday in February in the year of our Lord
 One thousand seven hundred and eighty eight, which said Execution
 was to have been had on Wednesday the nineteenth Day of
 March last: And whereas the said Execution hath been
 respited from time to time until Friday the twenty fifth of
 this instant April or until our further pleasure. Know
 ye therefore that of our especial Grace we have pardoned
 unto the said James Sands and Jacob Dyer, not that they
 suffer any corporal or other punishment therefor but that they
 shall stand and be in the same Plight and Condition to all
 Intents and Purposes whatsoever as if the crime whereof
 they the said James Sands and Jacob Dyer have been
 convicted had never been done or committed. Provided
 the said James Sands and Jacob Dyer shall severally de-
 -part this State within thirty Days from the Date hereof
 and the United States within thirty Days thereafter
