The State of Maryland To all our Bailiffs and Good People
 to whom these presents shall come Greeting
 W^m Smallwood.

Whereas it appears by the Petition of
 many Inhabitants of Baltimore Town that at a Court of Oyer
 and terminer and Goal delivery hold for the County of Baltimore in
 the present term of July 1788 a certain John Kinkade was indicted
 for having feloniously stole a Waggon Whip of the value of three
 shillings current Money being the property of a certain Henry Wor-
 thington, on which Indictment he was arraigned, plead not guilty,
 and a Verdict was found against him - And whereas the Petition-
 ers, among whom are the Jury who found the Bill against the
 said John Kinkade, have recommended him as a person of family
 and good Character heretofore, and as a proper Object for a Pardon
 I have thought it proper, and do hereby pardon the said John
 Kinkade and do order and direct that no Corporal Punishment
 be inflicted on him the said John Kinkade for the said Offence,
 but that he shall stand and be in the same plight and condition
 to all Intents and purposes so far as he might be corporally
 affected, as if the Offence aforesaid had never been committed.
