The State of Maryland To the Sheriff of Baltimore

County Greeting.

Whereas it appears by the Petition of Jane Hendricks, now the wife of William M<sup>c</sup>Quinn of the County aforesaid that she was convicted at the late Criminal Court for Baltimore County, of a Felony, that she hath suffered a long and rigorous Imprisonment, made full restitution to the party injured, and is truly sorrowful for the Offence - And whereas several of the Inhabitants of Baltimore Town have certified that they believe the facts stated in the said petition to be true and recommend her for a pardon, in which recommendation the Chief Judge of the said Criminal Court concurs - I have thought it proper and do hereby pardon the said Jane Hendricks now M<sup>c</sup>Quinn and do order and direct that she shall not suffer any corporal or other punishment therefor but that she shall stand and be in the same plight and condition to all intents and purposes as if the Crime whereof she the said Jane Hendricks now M<sup>c</sup>Quinn hath been convicted, had never been done or committed. -
