

Annapolis October 30. 1788<sup>th</sup>

Whereas William Davis of Baltimore County is now confined in the Goal of the said County on a presentment in the last June Criminal Court of said County for perjury in not returning according to his Oath certain real and personal property in his Schedule, on his application to the Chancellor for the benefit of the Act respecting insolvent Debtors, whereby it appeared that he intended to defraud his creditors - And Whereas it now appears by the Certificate of Stephen Wagon Trustee to the said Davis, that he hath since given in to the Chancellor the property which he had concealed and which was not returned in the said Schedule - And three of the Justices of the Criminal Court aforesaid, together with his creditors having recommended him to the notice of the Governor - I have thought proper that all Proceedings at Law against the said William Davis for the said Offence do cease and determine, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him the said William Davis for or concerning the same.
