

Wilson not that he suffer any corporal or other Punishment therefor but that he shall stand and be in the same Pledge and Condition to all intents and purposes whatsoever as if the Crime aforesaid had not been committed. But we do hereby declare that nothing herein contained shall affect or be construed to affect the execution of any Sentence or adjudication of the Court aforesaid passed on the said Samuel Wilson for any other Offence than what is herein particularly specified -

Whereas on the twenty fifth day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty seven our Pardon was granted to Thomas Waffon who had been tried at, and convicted in the County Court of Baltimore held on the Tuesday before the Monday preceding the first Tuesday in February One thousand seven hundred and eighty seven for feloniously stealing taking, and carrying away One horse of the value of fifteen pounds of the goods and Chattels of Jeremiah Jones, which said Pardon was conditioned that he the said Thomas Waffon should within ten days after the delivery of the same depart this State
