

Whereas James Bryan late of Baltimore County, was at a Court of oyer and terminer and goal delivery, held for the said County, the twenty fourth day of June seventeen hundred and eighty eight, indicted, tried and found guilty of Felony in Stealing a Cow, and thereupon sentenced for the said offence, to work and labour on the public roads of Baltimore County for three years, or in making repairing and cleaning the Streets or Bason of Baltimore town - And whereas it is represented by the Petition of several respectable inhabitants of the town and county aforesaid that the said James Bryan hath been employed several months at hard labour on the public roads in virtue of the sentence aforesaid; and it appearing by the certificate of one of the Commissioners of the public roads in said County, that the said James Bryan's conduct since his employment has been honest and upright - I have thought it proper to pardon the said James Bryan for the offence aforesaid, and do hereby order and direct that he be forthwith discharged from the service to which he hath been sentenced by the Court aforesaid -
