The State of Maryland

To all our Bailiffs and good people to whom this presents shall come greeting
 Whereas James Dixon late of Baltimore County Yeoman was at assize of Oyer and Terminer and goal delivery for said County, the sixteenth day of July seven hundred and eighty eight tried on a presentment, and found guilty of receiving of a certain Joseph Southerland, seven and one half yards of silk of the Goods and Chattels of William Thebeck He and secreting the said silk knowing the same to be stolen by the said Joseph Southerland, and the said James Dixon was thereupon adjudged by the said Court to work and labour two years on the public roads in Baltimore County or in making repairing and cleaning the Streets or Basins in Baltimore town. And whereas the said James Dixon having been recommended by several respectable inhabitants of Baltimore town for a pardon I have thought it proper to pardon the said James Dixon for the offense aforesaid, and do hereby order and direct that he be forthwith discharged from the service to which he hath been sentenced.
