To all our Bailiffs and good

H. Howards. people to whom these presents shall come
 greeting

Know ye that of our especial
 Grace we have pardoned unto Negro Anthony late of Caroline
 County Labourer otherwise called King, the slave of a certain
 Thomas Pennington of the same County as a proper object
 of our mercy the suit of our peace and whatsover appertain-
 -eth unto us for that he on the twenty third day of July in
 the year seventeen hundred and eighty nine about the hour
 of eleven in the night of the same day with force and arms
 at the County aforesaid the dwelling house of Robert Brown
 there situate feloniously and burglaryously did break and
 enter and one Cagg of Barley of the value of thirty shillings
 of the goods and Chattels of the said Robert Brown in
 the same dwelling house then and there feloniously and
 burglaryously did steal take and carry away against
 the peace Government and Dignity of the State of Maryland
 whereof he the said Negro Anthony otherwise called King
 hath been convicted before the worshipful Philemon
 Downes and others his associates, Justices of the County
 Court of the same County held for Caroline County at
 Melvills Warehouse in the County aforesaid on the
 Monday before the third Tuesday in October being the nine-
 -teenth day in the year seventeen hundred and eighty nine.

Nevertheless we grant unto him the said
 Negro Anthony alias King our full peace and were
