I have thought it proper and do hereby pardon the said
James Doyle and do order and direct that the said James
Doyle be forthwith discharged from the service to which

Offence aforesaid had never been committed —

Whereas Negro Jeffery, the property of
Susanna Nelson of Baltimore town, was at the last Criminal
Court of Baltimore County found guilty of felony, and there-
-upon sentenced by the said Court to work and labour
for two years — that by the petition of several respectable
inhabitants of Baltimore town, it is represented, that
previous to the said Offence he was deemed honest faithful
and dutiful, and that he had been led to the commission
of the said Offence by the instigation of a noted offender,
that he now appears to be a sincere penitent and an
object worthy of the clemency of Government — and that
of the Justices of the said Court having also recommended
him for a pardon I have thought it proper to pardon
