Whereas Jacob Hilderbrand late of Frederick  
County, was at a County Court begun and held at Frederick  
town in and for the County aforesaid on the third Tuesday  
of August seventeen hundred and eighty nine presented for  
taking and carrying from Thomas Taylor a bundle  
of Hay about ten pounds weight and at November term  
following a Bill of Indictment was found against him  
by the Grand Jurors for the said Offence And whereas  
the said Jacob Hilderbrand together with Thomas Taylor  
have by their Petition solicited the interpositions of Government  
in the said Hilderbrand's favor and three of the Justices  
of the said Court having by their Certificate represented  
him to have conducted himself in such a manner as  
not only to avoid the suspicion of any crime except  
the charge now against him, but so far as have reached  
their knowledge to have supported the reputation of an  
honest Man and recommending him as a proper  
object of mercy I have thought proper to order and  
direct that all Proceedings at Law for the said  
Offence do cease and determine and that no further  
Prosecution be had or carried on against him for or
