Whereas on the thirteenth Day of

January last for Baltimore Court was tried in the Court
of Oyer and Terminer and Goal delivery an Indictment

against named Fisher late of Baltimore County Yeoman
for Receiving of Negro Jiss the Slave of Margaret Wining

and Negro Durham the Slave of Brittingham Dickenson

four Quarter Casks of Wine which had been stolen by the
said Jiss and Durham from a certain Benjamin Lanning

knowing the same to be stolen and thereupon the said

named Fisher was adjudged by the Justices of the said Court
of Oyer and Terminer to serve and Labour on the public

Roads of Baltimore County or in Making repairing and
Cleaning the Streets or Blasen of Baltimore Town until

the first Day of November seventeen hundred and Ninety
one. And several of the Inhabitants of Baltimore town

having solicited a Pardon. I have thought it proper to

pardon the said named Fisher for the Offence aforesaid
and do hereby order and direct that he be forthwith dis-

charged from the service to which he hath been adjudged

Provided the said named Fisher shall within thirty
days from the delivery hereof depart from this State and

never return back into it again Given under the Seal

of the State of Maryland this twenty seventh Day of
May in the Year of our Lord one thousand Seven hundred

and Ninety —
