

aforesaid Tobacco house and Corn house the said Tobacco
 house then and there having Tobacco therein and the said
 Corn house then and there having Corn therein and that
 the said Negro James then and there being the slave of the
 said Henry Ridgely Junior did then and there with force
 and arms wilfully wickedly and feloniously attempt to burn
 the said out house so being then and there contiguous to and
 adjacent with the said Tobacco house and Corn house the said
 Tobacco house then and there having Tobacco therein as
 aforesaid and the said Corn house then and there having
 Corn therein and then and there wilfully wickedly and
 feloniously with force and arms did burn and destroy the
 said out houses and the said Tobacco house and Corn house
 contrary to the Act of Assembly in that case made and
 provided and against the Peace Government and Dignity
 of the State of Maryland - Whereof he the said James hath
 been convicted before the Judges of the General Court held
 for the Western Shore at May Term Seventeen hundred and
 Ninety - Nevertheless we grant unto him the said
 James our firm peace and will not that he suffer any
 Corporal or other punishment therefor but that he shall
 stand and be in the same plight and condition to all
 intents and purposes what soever as if the crimes aforesaid
 or either of them had never been committed - Provided the
 said Henry Ridgely Junior shall relinquish his claim on the
 State for the value of the said Negro James, and shall within
 Sixty Days from the date hereof transport or cause to be trans-
 ported to some one of the West India Islands or otherwise
 beyond the Seas the said James never to return back into
