The State of Maryland

To all our Bailiffs and  
good people to whom these presents  
shall come Greeting

Whereas on the Eleventh day of January  
last appeared before the Justices of the Court of Oyer and Terminer  
and Goal delivery for Baltimore County Catherine Potter  
of said County, who heretofore on Suspicion of being a common  
Prostitute, was ordered by Samuel Chase Esq one of the Justices  
of the said Court to appear before any two or more of the said  
Justices of Oyer and Terminer and Goal delivery who having  
heard the said Catherine Potter in defence it appeared that  
she was a common Prostitute and refused to give good security  
for her good behaviour the said Justices thereupon adjudged  
the said Catherine Potter to work and labour on the public Roads  
of Baltimore County or in Making Repairing or Cleansing the  
streets or Basin of Baltimore town until the first day of  
November next. And the Commissioners of the Poor for Baltimore  
County having recommended her as an Object worthy of  
pity I have thought it proper to pardon the said Catherine  
Potter for the Offence of so said and do hereby order and direct  
that she be forthwith discharged from the Service to which she  
hath been adjudged. Given under the Seal of the State  
of Maryland this twenty fifth Day of June in the Year of our  
Lord one thousand Seven hundred and Ninety —
