To all our Bailiffs
and good people to whom these presents
shall come Greeting
R Howard

Whereas on the Eleventh Day of January
last appeared before the Justices of the Court of Oyer and
Terminer and Goal delivery for Baltimore County Judith
Brady of said County, who heretofore on Suspicion of being a
Common prostitute was ordered by Samuel Chase Esq one
of the then Justices of the said Court to appear before any
two or more of the said Justices of Oyer and Terminer and
Goal delivery who having heard the said Judith Brady
in defence it appeared that she was a common Prostitute
and Refused to give good Security for her good behaviour the
said Justices thereupon adjudged the said Judith Brady
to work and labour on the public roads of Baltimore County
or in Making Repairing or Clearing the Streets or Pavement of
Baltimore town until the first day of November next and
the said Judith Brady having been recommended to the Clemency
of Government by several Inhabitants of Baltimore town.

I have thought it proper to pardon the said Judith Brady for
the offence aforesaid and do hereby order and direct that she
be forthwith discharged from the service to which she hath been
adjudged.
