 good People to whom these Presents shall
 come Greeting

I. Howard
 Know ye that of our special Grace we
 have pardoned unto Negro Adam late of Montgomery
 County labourer the Slave of a certain Edward Jones of the same
 County as a proper Object of our Mercy, the Suit of our Peace
 and whatsoever appertaineth unto us for that he on the first
 Day of August in the year of our Lord seventeen hundred
 and Ninety at the County aforesaid with force and Arms
 the Store house of a certain Frederick Whitzel not being contiguous
 or used with any Mansion house feloniously did break
 and enter and our Gun of the Value of five Shillings carried
