

Indianapolis November 27. 1790

Whereas it is represented by the Petition of Thomas
 Coad of Saint Mary's County that he fell in Company, and having
 drunk very freely got into a quarrel with a certain Cuthbert Clark
 during which he threw a Stone at the said Clark which
 unfortunately hit him and the blow brought on in a few Days
 a broken Jaw of which he died - and that the Grand Jury have
 Presented the said Thomas Coad for the Murder of the said
 Cuthbert Clark he most solemnly declares that he had no
 intention of injuring him, And Whereas several respectable
 inhabitants of the said County, together with the widow of the
 deceased having earnestly recommended him to the ^{the} Clemency of
 Government I have thought proper to order and direct that
 all proceedings at Law for the said Office do cease and
 determine and that no further Prosecution be had or carried
 on against the said Thomas Coad for or concerning the same
