 fifteenth Day of the same Month and year aforesaid
 by the trial of a Jury of the facts contained in the
 Indictment above mentioned against the said Eleanor
 Cunningham before the Justices of Baltimore County
 Court of Oyer and terminer and goal delivery she
 was found guilty thereof and was adjudged by the
 said Justices to serve and labour in a place of con-
 finement agreeable to Act of Assembly, for the term
 of one year - And whereas several respectable
 Inhabitants of Baltimore town having represented
 her to have been previous to the commission of this
 offence an honest industrious Woman, and recommended
 her to mercy, I have therefore thought it proper to
 pardon the said Eleanor Cunningham for the offence
 aforesaid, and do hereby order and direct that she
 be forthwith discharged from the service to which
 she hath been adjudged -
