

Annapolis April 19<sup>th</sup> 1791.

Whereas John Hill late of Baltimore County Yeoman hath been presented to the Grand Jury of the Court of Oyer and Terminer and Goal delivery for Baltimore County aforesaid, and a Bill of Indictment found against him for stealing and carrying away on the tenth day of January last, one piece of Pork of the value of sixteen pence current Money of Maryland of the Goods and Chattels of Samuel Wineman - and it being represented by several respectable inhabitants of Baltimore Town that they believe the prosecution against him the said John Hill to be false and malicious, and that he is an honest industrious respectable citizen - I have thought proper to order and direct that all proceedings at Law against the said John Hill for the said Offence do cease and determine, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him for or concerning the same.
