To all our Bailiffs and  
good people to whom these presents  
shall come Greeting.

Whereas Mary Coffee late of  
Baltimore County did, on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of May last  
by order of John Hoale Esquire one of the Justices of  
Oyer and Terminer and Goal delivery for Baltimore County  
aforesaid, appear before three of the Justices of the Court  
of Oyer and Terminer and Goal delivery for the said  
County on suspicion of being a vagrant - Whereupon it  
appearing to the Justices aforesaid that she was a  
vagrant, she was adjudged to serve and labour in some  
place of confinement as a female criminal agreeably  
to the Act of Assembly for the space of one year  
And the Trustees of the poor of Baltimore County  
having recommended her the said Mary Coffee to the  
Clemency of Government. I have thought it proper  
to pardon the said Mary Coffee for the offence
