I have thought it proper to pardon the said John Agnew for the Offence aforesaid. And do therefore hereby Order and direct that he be forth with discharged from the Sentence aforesaid. Given under the Seal of the State of Maryland. This twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord one Thousand seven hundred and ninety two.

Whereas Levi Everitt late of Queen Anns County Yeoman, was at a County Court of the said County held at Chester Mill on the third Monday in May last indicted tried and found guilty for that he the said Levi Everitt on the twenty Ninth day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety one with force and Arms at the County aforesaid in the public highway there in And upon one James Tubbert in the Peace of God and the said State then and there being feloniously did Make an Assault and him the said James Tubbert in bodily fear and danger of his life in the highway aforesaid then and there feloniously did put and one Bank Note of the value of five Dollars Current Money and three french crowns of the value of twenty five Shillings Current of the Goods and Chattels of the said James Tubbert from the person and against the will of the said James Tubbert in the highway aforesaid then and there feloniously did
