To all our Bailiffs and good People to whom these Presents shall come Greeting

Whereas on the fifth day of September last our Commission and Warrant did issue for the Execution of Negro Nelly late of Baltimore County the Slave of Philip Graybell Esquire who had been convicted of the Murder of her Child at a Court of Oyer and Terminer and Goal delivered for Baltimore County the second Tuesday in August in the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety two which said Execution was to have been carried into effect on Friday the twenty first Day of September aforesaid. And Whereas the said Execution hath been respited from time to time until Friday the nineteenth Day of October last or until our further pleasure. And several respectable Inhabitants of Baltimore having earnestly solicited the interposition of Government in her favour. I have thought it proper to pardon the said Nelly for the offence aforesaid not that she suffer any Corporal or other punishment therefor but that she shall stand and be in the same plight and condition to all Intents and purposes whatsoever as if the Crime aforesaid had never been committed.
