I have thought proper to order and direct that all proceedings at Law for the said Offence do cease and determine and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against the said Jesse Walker for or concerning the same.

Whereas at Baltimore County Court of Oyer and Terminer and Goal Delivery November Term Seventeen Hundred and Ninety two a certain John Perry of Baltimore County aforesaid was presented, for that he on the Nineteenth Day of the same Month and year aforesaid at the County aforesaid with force and Arms bore one piece of coined silver commonly called a french Crown of the value of eight shillings and four pence current Money one piece of coined silver commonly called a Spanish Milled Dollar of the value of seven shillings and six pence like Money and five pieces of coined silver commonly called Quarters of Spanish Milled Dollars each of the value of one Shilling and ten pence half penny current Money of Maryland.
