 to the Clemency of Government I have thought it proper  
 to Pardon the said John Perry for the Offence aforesaid  
 And do therefore hereby Order and direct that he be  
 forthwith discharged from the Sentence aforesaid  
 Given under the Seal of the State of Maryland  
 This twenty ninth Day of November in the Year of our  
 Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety two
