

we grant unto him the said Jack our firm Peace and
 will not that he suffer any Corporal or other punishment
 therefor but that he shall stand and be in the same plight
 and Condition to all Intent and purposes whatsoever as
 if the Crime aforesaid had never been done or committed.
 Provided the Sheriff of Frederick County shall and he
 is hereby required and Comanded within forty Days
 from the Date hereof to sell and dispose for the Benefit
 of the State the said Negro Jack to some person or persons
 who shall engage to transport or cause to be transported
 the said Jack to some one of the West India Islands or
 otherwise beyond the Seas from whence he is never to return
 into this or either of the United States — Given under
 the seal of the State of Maryland this third Day of April in
 the Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety three.

Whereas Charles Grosuch of William
 late of Baltimore County Yeoman was at a Court of Oyer and
 Terminer and Goal delivery for the County aforesaid at November
 term last Presented and found guilty of Stealing one Stallion
 of a Roan colour of the value then pounds Current Money of Mary-
 land of the goods and Chattels of Joseph Stator and was by
 the Court aforesaid adjudged to serve and labour on the public
 Roads of Baltimore County or in Making repairing and
 cleaning the Streets or Basons of Baltimore town for the
 term of three years. And Whereas the Justices of the
 said Court together with several respectable Inhabitants of
 Baltimore County aforesaid having recommended him
 to the Clemency of Government I have thought it proper
 to pardon the said Charles Grosuch for the Offence aforesaid
 and do therefore hereby Order and direct that he be forthwith dis-
 gaged from the service to which he hath been adjudged. Given under the
