Presbury and Job Smith Esquires two of the Associate Justices before whom the said Negro Henry was tried, have recommended him a fit object of Mercy, I have therefore thought proper to pardon the the said Negro Henry for the offence aforesaid and do hereby order and Direct that he be discharged

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
