The State of Maryland To all our Bailiffs and good people  
Ben Ogil To whom these presents shall come greeting  
Whereas Adam Faulx of Cecil County has been  
presented and found guilty of felony and was  
by the Court of the said County sentenced to serve and labour  
on the public Roads of Baltimore County for and during the  
Term of three years; and whereas a number of respectable persons  
have recommended him to me as deserving the interposition  
of Government; I have thought proper to pardon the said  
Adam Faulx for the offence aforesaid, and do hereby order  
and direct that he be forthwith discharged from the service  
to which he hath been adjudged, Given under my hand and  
Seal this day of Eighteen hundred and one -

City of Annapolis August 18th 1801

Whereas Benjamin the Mulatto slave of Thomas Baxton  
of Montgomery County, did on the Twenty fifth day of July  
last run away from his master and after concealing himself  
some days returned and took a mare the property of one of the  
sons of the said Baxton, and made his escape with said mare  
and was afterwards caught and confined in Frederick  
County goal as a runaway and horse stealing, and whereas  
it is represented to me by the said Thomas Baxton that  
he is desirous of sending the said slave out of the State  
of Maryland so that he never shall return again I have  
Thought
