The ~~State~~ of Maryland to the Sheriff of Baltimore County
Greeting, Whereas Jacob L. Guinn of the said
John S. Munn County was presented at Baltimore Court last
for stealing thirty dollars of the good and Chattels
of Stephen McFormick and was by the said Court at November
Term last sentenced to serve and labour on the public Roads
of Baltimore County for and during the Term of one year
and whereas it appears from the representation of the
said Court, that the said L. Guinn was deranged at the
time of the Commission of the above felony and they having
recommended him to me as a fit object of Mercy; I have
therefore thought proper to pardon the said L. Guinn for the
offence aforesaid, and do therefore order and direct that he
be released from the punishment to which he hath been
adjudged; Given under my hand and the seal of the State
of Maryland this Twenty second day of December Eighteen
hundred and one

Greeting, Whereas Roger McGinnis late of the said County
was presented as an accessory in two several presentments
the one for aiding and abetting the stealing of the goods and
Chattels of John Lyle, the other the goods of a person
unknown, and being convicted of both offences was by the
said Criminal Court of Baltimore County at January
Term last sentenced to work and labour on the public
Roads of Baltimore County for and during the Term of
Eighteen months, and whereas it appears from the petition
of the said McGinnis that he was convicted on the Evidence
of a certain John McDonald who was sentenced five
several times in the Gaol and City of Philadelphia
