of Maryland this Eighteenth day of December Eighteen hun-
dred and Two

Greeting, the information expected from Chief Justice
Clayton and others relative to the case of William Chadwell

Execute the said William Chadwell as heretofore
directed by my warrant of Execution unless otherwise
