

Annapolis, November 13. 1805

The State of Maryland to all our Bailiffs and Good People to whom this presents shall come greeting. Whereas I did on the thirty first Day of July last, grant a pardon to Henry L. White (who was found guilty of passing two promissory notes, under the Signature of James Corrie, knowing them to be forged) on Condition that he enlist on Board of one of the Vessels of war, of the United States. And whereas it has been stated to me that the Officers of the Navy have refused to enlist him on account of his youth, and other Causes, and that there is no probability that the said Pardon will take effect; I have therefore thought proper to pardon the said H. L. White, of the offence aforesaid, on this express Condition that the said Henry L. White, do within fifty Days from this Date, depart the State of Maryland; and do not at any time thereafter, return into any part thereof, and if the said H. L. White do not fully and strictly comply with the Condition aforesaid, then this Pardon to be null and void, so that no Benefit or Advantage shall arise to the said H. L. White from the same or any part thereof. and I do hereby revoke my said Pardon of July the thirty first. Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Maryland this thirteenth Day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five.
