The State of Maryland to wit: Whereas Jno. Frizzel of Baltimore County aged about fifteen years has been charged at the Criminal Court of the said County at March Term Inst. with ~~murder~~ with a man. And whereas several respectable persons Inhabitants of Baltimore County who are well acquainted with the said Frizzel have declared their entire belief of his innocence and have recommended the granting a Noli prosequi: I have therefore thought proper to order and direct that all proceedings at Law against the said Frizzel do cease and determine, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him ~~for the said charge~~ for or concerning the same.
