Dougherty slave belonging to Mr Walter Simpson
the Bags and Coffee the property of M^r Coy and Co
And whereas it has been most satisfactorily represented
ed to me that the said Thomas Tate has heretofore been
an honourable and respectable character and that
said offence was committed through the indiscretion
of his wife, I have therefore thought proper to order
and direct that all proceedings at law against the
Thomas Tate do cease and determine and that no further
prosecution be had or carried on against him for or on
