Sheweth

The humble Petition of Philip Murry
Unto your Honours that your Petitioner hath lately
Obtained a Commission from your Honours to be Commanders of
of Christina Fort and being willing and desirous in all things
to behave himself so that no Prejudice may be done to his
Lordship or others, by his Ignorance or otherwise

He humbly supplicates your Honours to Order that he
may have Instructions how to proceed in the Command aforesaid
for the Encouragement of himself and such as shall be under his
Command whereby he may no ways prejudice his Lordships
Interest, nor be liable to any Miscarriage in the Command aforesaid

And as in Duty Bound he shall pray
Ordered that the Instructions formerly given Col^o George
Tillot concerning the Fort at Christina Bridge be read and
followed by the Petitioner and the Men now under his Command
