this Province by any Strangers Foreigners or others to the Preju-
dice of his Lordship the Right Honourable the Lord Proprie-
tary of this Province, his Heirs and Successors in the Dimina-
tion of his and their Right Title and Claim, of, in and unto
the same, or to the disturbance of the good People of this same
Province in the Peaceable and quiet Possession of any part
thereof their Goods and Properties Personis and Estates, and that
Breach of his Lordships Peace, and that in Order thereto they
and every of them do upon all Occasions of that Nature Exercise
and make Use of the powers and authorities granted them in
and by their several and respective Commissions and Instructions,
with all diligent and prudent Care and Moderation to be taken
herein.
