of a Mannor the petitioner paying or Securing to be paid to his Lordship
for the same as by the Conditions of Plantations now in Force within this
Province is required or otherwise as to his Lordship shall seem meet

That your Petitioners Ephraim and Gasparus Herman have
granted unto them by Letters patents from his Royal Highness's Government
of New York a Tract of Land for 600 Acres, lying on Delaware Bay betw
between Opoquammin and Saint Austens Creeks together with the Swamp
and Marshes therein and therunto Contiguous, and your Petitioners
Ephraim Herman and Johannes De Hayes by Letters patent as aforesaid
one other Tract of Land for 400 Acres lying in Opoquammin Creeks
at the Old Landing as may be made appear to your Lordship
