

It is ordered that Notice be given to the Ambassadors to attend their answer the next day according to former orders of the Board.

Mr. [unclear] After the Answer agreed upon the said Augustine Herman and Resolved Waldron presented the following Paper or Vigt.

Upon the Sight and View of my Lord Baltimore's Patent this 7<sup>th</sup> day of October 1659 presented unto us by the Honble Governor and Council of Maryland.

To say Reserved only what the Honble Governor General and Council of the new Netherlands in the Behalf of our Lords Proprietors and Sovereigns the high and mighty States Generale of the United Provinces might have to Alledge against it.

We Repeal and Refute every manner Declaration or manifestation the 6<sup>th</sup> of this instant Delivered unto the Honble Governor and Council of the Province of Maryland, and say further.

That the original Foundation of the afo Patent sheweth and maketh appear that my Lord Baltimore hath to his Royall Majestie of England petitioned for a Country in the parts of America which was not which was not Soctes and taken up before only inhabited (as he saith) by a certain Barbarous People the Indians. Upon which Ground his royall Majestie did grant and Conferre the said Patent?

But now whereas our South River of old called Napsaw River of the new Netherlands (by the English Surnamed Delaware) was taken up and appropriated and purchased by Virtue of Commission and Grant from the High and mighty States Generale of the United Provinces long before, Therefore whis Royall Majesties Intention and Justice not to have given and granted that part of a Country which before was taken in possession and stated by the Subjects of the High and mighty States Generale all of the United Provinces as is Declared and manifested heretofore. So that the Claim my Lord Baltimore's Patent Speaks of to Delaware Bay or a part thereof in severall other Respects and Punctuality is invalid. of which we desire that notice may be Taken — Actumus ab over

Whereupon the Council resolved to take no notice of that paper and ordered the Answer to be Engraved, and so adjourned till next Day three of the Clock afternoon.
