

Province taking and keeping to your own use all such goods on Shore which shall
 be seized by you as aforesaid to do all and everything which much Care and the
 Charge and Office of a Captain or Commander in chief for the said Expedition under
 our Lieutenant of the said Province belonging which persons so taken you are to.
 Bring and deliver to our Lieutenant of the said Province for the same sailing and all
 Vessels with their Goods so taken you are to bring into some Port of our Province
 without Breaking Bulk Setting Divorcing or Altering the Property of any of the
 said Vessels or Goods before you have caused the same to be duly inventoried and
 appraised and adjudged in our said Province lawful Prizes after which adjudica-
 tion you may take and keep the same to your own use Paying unto us or our
 Receiver General there for the time being for our use the sum of one part of the value
 thereof at the appraisement provided that by Protection thereof you neither do
 nor permit to be done any Violence or Injury to any Ship Goods or Merchandizes
 whatsoever other than of the Enemies Piratts and Robbers or their Abettors and
 Abettors as aforesaid And also that before you putt this our Commission in Execution
 you Enter into a Recouerance of One Thousand Pounds Sterling to us before our
 Lieutenant of our said Province for the Performance of the aforesaided Parti-
 culars required on your Part And we do hereby will and require our Lieut.
 Admiral and all other our Captains Commissioners and Officers to use well
 as milittary by Sea and by Land thereto be aiding and assisting to you in
 the Execution of this our Commission Given under our Hand and Great Seal
 Sealed Letters this twentyeighth Day of July in the nine and twentie Year of our
 Commission over Maryland and in the Year of our Lord God One Thousand Six
 hundred and Sixty.



And upon Consideration had first that it is very
 Doubtfull whether the Town of New Amstel doth wth in the Limits of this
 Province or not and that his Lordship doth not Authorize all War with any but
 such as have usurped some part of this Province or shall Abett or aid such as
 have usurped some Part of this Province and next that his Lordship hath left
 it as appears by the words of the Letter to us to find the way to Reduce the
 Supposed Intruders and usurpers upon Confidence of Assistance from Virginia
 and new England that might be given us which doth not at all seem likely
 the Dutch Trade being the Darling of the People of Virginia as well as
 this Province and indeed all other Plantations of the English and this Province
 alone not being able to bear the Charge of the War that will thence ensue
 with the West Indians Company in Holland upon any attempt upon that
 place which not only from their Proclamation first of September last made
 at Amsterdam but also by late Letters from Holland appears to be resolved
 by them to use any force shall be used by us against the said Town of
 New Amstel Resolved that all Actions to be taken against the said
 Town of New Amstel till such time as Letters from the Admirall may
 be had in Answer of what shall be written to him concerning
 concerning his affaires and that Observations may be taken of the said Town of New Amstel
