

Durham and that from thence to Mount Scarborough, be likewise  
erected into a County and called as the Lord Proprietary shall hereafter direct.

Ordered that notice be given to the Sheriffs of Somerset Dorset, Dorchester,  
Essex and Baltimore Counties that what Persons will, shall any Lands on  
the Seaboard Side and Delaware Bay from the Bounds of Virginia to the degree  
Forty Northward Latitude shall for their Encouragement pay only one Shilling  
Starting Rent & Premium for every fifty Acres which he or they shall take up  
upon Legall warrant, and that the Surveyor General do attorney some Person  
as he shall think fit to Survey the same and lay out by former order two  
Manors for his Lordships use in each County. Each Manor to Contain  
Six Thousand Acres apiece.

Ordered that the Surveyor General do make out the  
Northerly Bounds of this Province as near as possible at the Degree Forty  
and Return his observations to the Deputy Surveyor in Council.

Ordered that Mr William Brooks the Governor  
Shewd be desired to provide the Gouvernours Schoop with Men & Victuals  
for the accomodating the Surveyor General up the Bay, by the twenty  
fourth of October instant.

Copy of a Letter Sent from Newcastle the 26<sup>th</sup> of  
November 1669 unto Col: Francis Lovelace Gov: of New York.

Upon:

In Obedience to the right Honourable the Lord Proprietary  
of Marylandes order Viz! To cause to be Surveyed and Sealed all his Lordships  
Lands mentioned and contained within his Pallent to the Seaboard Side, and  
Delaware to the Latitude of forty degrees Northward. In pursuance of which  
having been at Newcastle upon Delaware River and found the sd Newcastle  
by observation made this day the six and twentie of November 1669 to lie in  
Thirty nine Degrees Thirty Minutes Northerly Latitude which is Thirty  
Minutes to the Southward from the Northern Bound of the Land granted by  
his Majestie of great Britaine to the Lord Proprietary of Maryland as by his  
Lordships Pallent more largely doth appear. But understanding the said  
Town of Newcastle (since his Majestie was most graciously pleased to send  
Orders to Reduce it from the usurped Power of Dutch) hath been protected  
under the Government of New York I could no less but acquaint your Honour  
of the claims I have made, and do by these Presents make in the name of the  
right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of Maryland to the said Town of New-  
castle and into all the Islands and Territories lying on the West to the  
main Ocean and Delaware from the Bounds of Virginia to the Latitude  
of forty Degrees Northward. So Hoping your Honour will not be an  
Obstruction to my Proceedings but quietly suffer his Majesties Subjects to be  
settled under that Power he hath most graciously been pleased to bestow  
upon the Lord Baron of Baltimore. I Recd. Dated 26 Nov: 1669
