

hundred pounds of Tobacco in Cash for every fifty acres, and noe
proportionably for a greater or lesser Quantity —

3. — That all which Land we take as aforesaid We doe for our selves
our heires and Successors Government and agree to and with such
Person or Persons as aforesaid taking up the same, to pay our Grant
under the yearly Rent of this out Province to him or them, and his
and their heirs and Uffspringes for ever, in fee and commonage
by Heatey only for all Services, under the yearly Rent of Two Hhds
Hhds for every fifty acres, with the reservation of the Royal Mines
(as is usual) & conditionally that if such person or persons, granted
or granted, shall not within three years after such grant, pay
and satisfie unto us or our heires, or such Officers or Officers as
aforesaid the Quantity of One hundred pounds of Tobacco for
every fifty acres as aforesaid, The said Grant unto him or them
refusing denying or longer delaying the same, shall be to all
intents and purposes void, nul, and of noe effect and the same
free and cleare for any other person or persons of the descent
aforesaid to take up under the Rents Services and Conditions
aforesaid the said former grant Notwithstanding Provided
also and it is our Intent and meaning that each persons
particular part or Dividure of Land shall be by its selfe and
particularly granted and partitioned —

4. — In Case you meete with any obstruction or opposition
from our Neighbouring Collonye Pennsylvania under the Government
of William Penn Esq. pretending claime to any the places
aforementioned or that any the Inhabitants thereof should
attempt to disturb or hirre the persons Cattle or goods of any
person or persons there already under our Government or willing
to embrace the same in manner aforesaid You are then immedi-
ately to acquaint the said William Penn therewith and demand
Satisfaction of him to be made by the party offending; which
undoubtedly (if the same be done without his Direction know-
ledge or consent) he will most readily grant you But in case
you find and shall be well satisfied that it is done by his
certaine Countenance you may then seek your own Satisfaction
as near as may be rotatating the same injury and damage
upon yester next Neighbour Inhabitants under his Government
& Dominion but with as much foudence and moderation as the
case will admitt —

5. — And that you may prevent the encroaching of y^e Inhabitants
of Pennsylvania upon this our Province, and their Inflexing
