

the people under us you are to use your greatest care Skill and Industry to procure the taking the uppermost parts thereof first as near as may be to the fourtenth degree which will bear means possibly to prevent their coming further down upon us

6 And for Encouragement of all such persons as shall come to take to Sea, Annapolis, and maintain Virginian Bridge, you are willed and required, and have hereby full power and Authority given you to Survey and lay out unto Them parts or Lots the Quarterly of One Thousand Acres of Land about the said Bridge the same to be distributed to and amongst any Seven persons of British or Irish descent that will undertake and endeavour to hold the same, to be confirmed to them their heires and Assignes for ever each of them One hundred acres under the yearly Rent of Two Shillings Sterling Royall Moneys only Reserved as aforesaid —

7 And whereas we have heard that a certain Indian hath publicly threatened your life whether of his own inclination or through the instigation of others We know not We therefore will that you use all diligent means care and concerning according to the best of your discretion to know the truth thereof and to find out the Indian who we are informed belongeth to Delaware, which if upon Enquiry made it appear so to be, you are then with all privacy Imaginable, and with what guard you think fit to goe to the Indian Scences and tell that nation know that they are within our Government, and that you are come from us to demand of delivery up of that Indian, to be proceeded against according to our Laws which you expect from them as an Acknowledg'mt of their Subjection to Us, to be renewed yearly, if they expect protection from us, or value our friendship —

8 If upon such demand made they shall consent to deliver him up or that you can otherwise apprehend the said Indian, without endangering a war with them and other nations, you are then to cause him to be forthwith conveyed downe to the Amburc Gunile about City of Philadelphia, for Examination and further proceeding thereon as we shall think fit —

9 And to the end that due Record may be kept of all your proceedings and Transactions in matter of Land according
