His Majesty approving the proposals made in this petition for the Advancement of those Plantations and the Hopeful trade of Furs is Graciously pleas'd to Confirm what is Contained in his former Condition and Letter under the Broad Seal and to that end Refereth to the Lord Arch Bishop of Canterbury Lord Keeper Lord Privy Seal and any other the Commissioners for Plantations who shall be near at hand and whom they please to Call the Consideration of all the Contents of this petition and with Wth Attorneys advise to settle such a Grant of the things herein desired as they shall think fit to be prepared by him for his Majesty's Signature their Duties are also to Examine the Wrongs Complain'd of and Certify his Majesty what they think fit to be done for redress hereof
